From the Rector's Desk

This past Saturday, I had a meeting with our church treasurer and went over the financial picture of our congregation. The picture isn't looking very good as we move into the last guarter of the church.

Again, it cost us about \$95,000.00 to take down the old church building. The diocese wanted us to put a Memorial Garden and Columbaria on that site which cost \$53,500.00. New gates for the cemetery will cost over \$10,000.00 and the ground work in the cemetery and in front of the church has cost us \$10,000.00. The paving and markings on our driveway cost us about \$40,000.00 last year. This work would have been impossible without receiving the money from two estates. <u>This money is now all used up</u> and used wisely for the good of our church.

We <u>do not use</u> estate money for the general operating budget of the church. We expect members of our congregation to give weekly to the operation of the church.

As you know, we now have our new heating system up and running with some minor work to be done in the near future. The cost of this work was a little over \$108,000.00. The money to pay this bill will come from our maintenance account, a bank loan of \$50,000.00 and remainder from general account.

Our greatest concern at this time is our weekly envelope giving. The budget for 2016 is \$95,000.00, and as of September 30th, we have received \$60,159.25. Our average per month runs \$5,000.00 to \$7,000.00. We need about \$1,900.00 per Sunday to meet our budget. Most Sundays, we are running a deficit in our weekly offering envelopes. Since the church has been consecrated, people are not giving as they gave before this happened. Some people's giving went down drastically because they did not agree with the handling of the old church. This is a sad story; we give to the church in thanksgiving for what God has given us. This month we celebrated Thanksgiving, remembering how God provide for us through the land and sea. We give in thanksgiving for what we receive from his hands.

My people, I call upon you now to give a little extra in your weekly envelopes over the remaining Sundays to meet our budget for 2016. We need \$177,000.00 this year to meet the needs of this church. Please help us.

I thank you all as parishioners of St Philip's for your kindness to the church in this community. Encourage your family members to worship with us each Sunday.

May God bless you as you serve Him here at St. Philip's?
