From the Rector's desk:

We have just come through a very busy season of the church calendar year, Lent, Holy Week and Easter. Now we are in a post-Easter Sunday season but still in the Easter season. For the next 6 Sundays we will be keeping with the Easter theme and the Ascension of Jesus, but, as we know, we are Easter people, so it is a celebration every single Sunday of the year. Now, as the gospel reading shows today, even after Jesus rose from the grave, there were still many who refused to believe in the resurrection. There are still people today who refuse to accept this, and, strangely enough some even call themselves Christians. The disciples are in a locked room, hiding from the Jews. They are afraid that there might now be repercussions for being followers of Jesus, because, as far as they are concerned Jesus is dead. Suddenly Jesus stands among them, not as a phantom ghost, but a real physical presence. He breaths upon them the Holy Spirit and immediately they are rejuvenated, now they know that Jesus is exactly who he said he is - the Son of God. This is the beginning of a band of disciples about to take the good news of Jesus' resurrection into the world. However, Thomas is missing, and, when they tell him of Jesus' appearance among them he refuses to believe unless he can see and feel the marks of the nails in Jesus' hands and put his fingers in the wounds of his side. One week later Jesus returns and this time Thomas is there, and Jesus provides him the opportunity to feel these marks, then Thomas believes. Jesus says blessed are those who have not seen but yet have come

to believe. We can't be too hard on Thomas. after all, it was quite something to accept on face value. Human nature is to have something tangible to base our beliefs on, how often have we said ourselves – I'll believe that when I see it? The very definition of faith is, believing in that which we cannot see but are convinced that it is real. There is the essence of the Holy Spirit; Jesus breathed that spirit upon them, and later on the day of Pentecost, following his ascension, it was given in a most powerful way, and to an even greater number of people. This was really the start of the Church going forth into the world. That spirit is the same one God has breathed upon us at baptism and again at Confirmation. We don't have to see the marks of nails and feel the physical wounds of Jesus, we have been given the spirit, it's what tells us deep in our minds and soul that Jesus is alive. It's what propels us into the community in witness and service to God.

- The Most Reverend Gregory Kerr-Wilson of the diocese of Calgary and Metropolitan of the Ecclesiastical Province of Rupert's Land;

- The Right Reverend Linda Nicholls of the diocese of Huron; and
- The Right Reverend Michael Oulton of the diocese of Ontario. Please keep them in your daily prayers, and may the work of the Holy Spirit be visible at the General Synod throughout their gathering.
