We have moved from the season of the Epiphany to the season of Lent. Our Lenten season began on Wednesday past with what we call "Ash Wednesday".

Lent will be for us the next forty days. This will be a time to follow and prepare ourselves as we move toward the great sacrifice of our Saviour upon a cross for each one of us. Over the next forty days, we will have a chance to reflect upon ourselves to examine our lives in relation to the cross.

"Today we hear of Jesus' 40 days in the desert. Lent is our desert experience: our confrontation with the forces of evil, our journey with Jesus to the fullness of life that we celebrate in this Eucharist.

Our tradition is to observe Lent in three ways: fasting, almsgiving and prayer. All of these are related to the temptations of Jesus in today's gospel and thus to our own experience of temptation.

When we are tempted to manipulate the goods of the earth, we can fast, using carefully and wisely all that we're given. When we are tempted to manipulate the lives of others, we can give alms, giving back to the poor the dignity and respect that belong to them. When we are tempted to manipulate God, we can pray, acknowledging God as our Creator, Saviour and Sanctifier whom we love.

We do not need to go away into the desert; the temptations are always with us. We'll make it through as Jesus did if we hold firm in our belief that the power of the Spirit sustains us. When we participate in the Eucharist, we have a perfect opportunity to experience together the strengthening and encouraging power of the Word of God and the Bread of Life." Collect for the Day: (In Unison): Almighty God, whose Son fasted forty days in the wilderness, and was tempted as we are but did not sin, give us grace to discipline ourselves in submission to your Spirit, that as you know our weakness, so may we know your power to save; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen

Collect for Launching out into the Deep: (In Unison): Bless, O Lord our God, the worship and work of this church. Grant that it may faithfully "launch out into the deep" and respond to the call of Jesus to be Fishers of People.
