From the Rector's desk:

At the time of this writing (June 29th), we are about to celebrate Canada Day, a very special day to give God thanks for this beautiful and diverse country we share together. There are many dark moments in the history of our nation that we are very sad about, especially in our relationships with indigenous peoples, and nothing more tragic, and sad than that of the pain of residential schools. We pray earnestly for the healing of broken relationships and trust with our indigenous brothers and sisters, that we may arrive at a place where we can all move forward together, celebrating both our commonalities and diversity. Canada is a nation made up of all ethnicities, cultures, religions, practices and traditions, and, it is in the sharing of that, and our understanding and appreciation of one another, that we become a stronger and more unified country. The tapestry we call "Canada", comes from 155 years of history, some we are not proud of, but much that gives us cause to celebrate. We have had several governments, federal, provincial and municipal, of all political stripes, that have worked hard to atone for past sins, to acknowledge responsibility, to accept liability, and compensate those that have been harmed. The work of Truth & Reconciliation continues in our country, and we are seeing much healing taking place. Our churches as well have been involved in this process of truth and reconciliation, and, speaking only from the perspective of our own denomination, have had huge success in working with indigenous peoples to move forward together as brothers and sisters in Christ. Much more remains to be done in this area, but I believe we are on the right track. I ask you to keep Pope Francis in your prayers, as he visits Canada in July, and meets with

indigenous peoples to apologize for the evil inflicted on them by the church. This will be a momentous event in the work of truth, reconciliation and healing in Canada, and follows closely behind the apology given by our own Archbishop of Canterbury, when he visited Canada recently.

So, whatever is good in this great nation, is what we are called to celebrate. What kinds of things do you celebrate as Canadian? What gives you motivation to fly the flag, gather with family and friends on Canada Day? When I look to our neighbours to the south, and see what is going on there, and hear every day of mass shootings, racial divide and violence, political anarchy, and so much more, I thank God fore Canada. It's not that Canada is perfect, God knows it is not, and that we have our own issues, but I see a much greater respect for one another. I see a country more welcoming of other races, other cultures, other religions, and a greater sense of compassion for those at risk. A good example of Canada's capacity to show compassion, is the welcoming of Ukrainian people fleeing from the assault of the Russian dictator Putin. That is but one example of how Canada has been built over the last 155 years. There are always those in every nation that oppose this kind of generosity, and are true racists at heart, and intolerable of other peoples and groups that are different than they are. We have that in Canada as well, but, thankfully very much a minority view. So, lets celebrate Canada, lets celebrate everything good about it, and give God thanks for the freedom we have in this country, for millions in our world can only dream of the lives we live here.

I take this opportunity, on behalf of myself and the parish of St. Philip, to wish you and your family **a very happy Canada Day 2022** and have a safe and enjoyable Summer.

The parishes of Portugal Cove, Bell Island and Pouch Cove have now entered into a missional arrangement for ministry on a one- year trial basis. This means that for the coming year one priest will serve all three of these parishes on a shared basis. The breakdown of this will see the priest spend 50% of his/her time in Portugal Cove, 25% on Bell Island and 25% in Pouch Cove. Please keep these three parishes in your prayers as they seek a priest to come and minister unto them.

The Canon EB Cheeseman Parish Centre is once again available for all rentals. With the rising cost of operating our facility, and the lack of rental income during the pandemic, this year (2022) there has been a slight increase in our rental fee structure. When booking the Centre through Donna and Janice they will provide all the information regarding the rental cost. Our rental fees are still well below comparable facilities in the area.

Please keep our bishops and spouses in your prayers as they prepare to travel to London, England for the Lambeth Conference, which takes place July 26^{th} – August 8^{th} . This meeting of all the Anglican bishops worldwide with the Archbishop of Canterbury takes place once every 10 years. This will be the very first one for our own bishop Sam, we pray for safe travel for him and his wife Jill. We also pray for the moving of the Holy Spirit in all their deliberations over those

two weeks of gathering.

Please help us keep our financial contributions up over the summer months. During the months of July and August church finances drop off as people are away on vacation or doing other summer activities. Throughout the pandemic we were blessed in that our parishioners were vigilant in getting their contributions into the parish, which enabled us to keep all our financial commitments up to date. It is no secret that many churches have been struggling during that time to get by during the pandemic, some are still struggling. We have been thankful to you all for thinking of the needs of your parish and being proactive in helping us stay on top of things.
