At our 4:00 pm service, the young people of our Sunday School will present the Christmas story through songs, drama and scriptural readings. In this service we will have a shortened form of the Eucharist because of the many parents and grandparents who will be here and won't be back to the other services. This service has really become a highlight of Christmas Eve here in the Parish. Therefore, it is important that
