From the Rector's desk in just a couple of days many people will remember the tragic events of September 11<sup>th</sup>, 2001, when hijacked airplanes flew into the North and South towers of the World Trade Center. As a result both 110 story towers collapsed killing 2996 people, injuring more than 6000 others, and, causing at least 10 Billion dollars in infrastructure and property damage. Over the years since, additional people have also died from 9-11 related cancer and respiratory diseases. That's 17 years ago, and, like many things, as time goes on it fades a bit more in our collective memories. In our province we continue to remember, and, take much pride in our humanitarian response on that day and subsequent days as planes were grounded at our airports, especially in Gander. It was a very natural response of hospitality from our people, but one that amazed others around the world, even those who were the recipients of that act of compassion, and, it really put our little province, and, more especially Gander and surrounding communities, on the map. It also inspired the Broadway musical Come From Away, which still enjoys tremendous success. For the rest of the world it was amazing, for us as a province it was natural to respond by caring for the stranded people of 9-11. No doubt such a response comes in part from our religious upbringing, as we saw the role played by churches

at that time. We can be proud of our province and of our people and churches, I'm sure Heaven rejoiced to see God's people reach out at 9-11. Our response was exactly the way Jesus carried out his ministry among us, as he went about doing good and healing all manner of disease among the people. This week's gospel reading is a good example of Jesus' example to us, as he extended his healing hand to the daughter of a gentile woman, a woman that no self-respecting Jew would have given the time of day to. It was an eyeopener for Jesus who had been steeped in Jewish religion and customs, to see that his ministry was for everyone that would come to him in faith, and not just the household of Israel. He also extends his hands to a man who was deaf and had a speech impediment, and the man is healed. Jesus would go on to do many more miracles of healing among all God's children, regardless of race, ethnicity, socio-economic status, Jew, Gentile, male or female. He threw the doors of God's love open wide to whosoever would enter. That's what we do as the Church, we respond with the love of Christ to everyone that comes our way. The invitation is extended from our parish of St. Philip's to everyone that would like to come among us. We welcome them with love, natural love that comes from following Jesus.
