From the Rector's Desk

I write to you today with a few news items as we are into the last quarter of the church's year.

Looking over the budget for 2015, I notice that our regular givings to the church is set at \$95,000 (weekly offering). As of Sept. 30th, we have received \$66,809.89. If we are to meet this budget by year-end, we must encourage each other to give a little extra over the next two months and encourage family members who have not given to do so.

At the present time, we are renting the Board Room (Oct. – Dec.) for election work leading up to the Provincial Election on Nov. 30th.

I meet with two teachers who are willing to rent the nursery each Saturday to assist young students with their studies (1-1/2 hr. per day). This will begin in Nov.

Each Thursday afternoon, Eastern Health is renting the Parish Centre for a Breast Feeding Clinic.

With these types of rentals, we really need to consider acquiring a part-time janitor.

By early next week, the site of our former place of worship will be cleared and ready for implementation of the plans approved by Vestry and at our Annual Congregational Meetings. (The plan is posted on the bulletin board in the foyer.)

This site will become known our "Memorial Garden of Peace", respecting those who have gone before us.

There are a number of other projects that will be carried out in 2016 if not completed in 2015. There will be paving and beautification around our church. In 2016, work will be done to improve the life of our cemetery.

I thought I would share these items with you so, as parishioners, you will know what is happening in the life of your parish.
