From the Rector's desk: As we follow our common lectionary, and, mark the events of Jesus' life and ministry, today we find ourselves commemorating the Baptism of Jesus. In our Anglican tradition, as many other Christian traditions, baptism is our initiation into the Christian faith; it makes us one with Christ, as we share in his baptism. In the church, we can do nothing greater, and, there is nothing more powerful, than baptism. As the birth of a child makes him/her part of a traditional family unit, and, a member of a much larger extended family, so too, baptism makes that child part of the family of God also, and, establishes a godly familial relationship with all of us. That's why baptism is no longer a private ceremony (unless in a case of medical emergency) but a sacrament of great celebration at the main service on a Sunday, that involves the entire congregation. We all share in the same baptism, and, we have a vital responsibility to support children and their families whenever we gather for baptism. Remember the question addressed to the entire congregation during the liturgy will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support this child in his/her life in Christ? Of course we all respond enthusiastically with two simple words – We will. Just two words but they place upon us an immense responsibility to that child. We are

to remember that child and his/her family in prayer, to ask God's grace upon them. As the godparents and parents are expected to honor the promises they make on behalf of the child, so too, we have an obligation to that child. It is not by coincidence that baptism services are combined with Holy Eucharist, as these two sacraments go hand in hand, and are the chief sacraments of the church. As a traditional family grows stronger as they share their lives together, so too, the family of God grows stronger as we meet regularly around the Lord's table and receive a holy meal of bread and wine, which becomes too us, the body and blood of Christ. Jesus was baptized by John in the Jordan river, not because he needed to have sin washed away, for he was without sin, but rather because he was leading us by example, showing us clearly how to become part of the family of God. Our next baptismal service will be held on February 3rd, and I pray we will already begin to pray for that child. As of now, I know of only one child to be baptized at that time, but there may be others, the child is Jenna Beverly Anne Bartlett, infant daughter of Kelly Squires and Francis Bartlett. Please keep that child and her parents in your daily prayers and devotions, for soon she will be part of our parish family here at St. Philip's.(Rev. Randy)

A reminder to those who find themselves as patients in our local hospitals, that hospital chaplains are available for pastoral care. Please don't assume that the chaplain will automatically know you are there. As we know, hospitals are very diligent in protecting the privacy of all patients, so it may be that your name will not be on the visitation list unless you specifically ask for it to be there. When you are admitted please be very clear that you want the Anglican chaplain to visit you if that is your wish.

Planned Giving is an important teaching of the church. Our diocese has a Planned Giving consultant that would love to speak to anyone that has an interest in learning more about how this works, especially the importance of having up-to-date wills, that state explicitly what a person's last wishes are for his/her estate. You can visit the diocesan website also to get more information, and, we do have brochures on the table in the fover. Here is some of the information you will see on the website: Remember that when you leave this earth, you can take with you nothing that you have received – only what you have given: a full heart enriched by honest service, love, sacrifice and courage. Thank you to all those who volunteer their time and give so freely of themselves in our parish. We are really blessed to have so many committed and faithful lay people involved in the life of our parish. We encourage everyone to get involved in some area(s) of parish life in 2019. You will be blessed by it and God will use you to bless others.

Thank you to the congregation for your support of the parish in 2018. Again, at the end of the year we were able to pay all of our bills and end the year on a sound financial footing. Our greatest single source of income, vital to the health of the parish, comes from your weekly envelopes and E-Transfer givings. In the past couple of years we set that part of our budget at \$95,000.00 In 2017 we reached \$88,448.00 of that amount, we are pleased that at the end of 2018 we achieved \$94,573.00, an increase of \$6124.00 or 7%. We were only \$427.00 from our budgeted goal, so we are very pleased with that increase. Please continue with your regular offerings, and, as God continues to bless you and bless our parish together, we have no doubt that at the end of 2019 we will surpass

this amount again. Remember your church depends entirely on you to remain healthy and vibrant doing God's work in the parish, in the diocese and beyond.

Many parishioners have signed up to be E-**Givers** . This is simply a direct giving plan, you determine what you want to contribute to the parish weekly, bi-weekly or monthly, and it automatically transfers from your account to the parish account. This eliminates the need to prepare church envelopes on Sunday, and, the good thing is that even when you can't make it to church you are still helping the parish to stay current with all its bills. When the offering plate comes around you simply drop in a small token card that says – I Give Electronically to Anglican Parish of St. Philip's. For anyone interested in signing up for this we have the forms available in the parish office. E-Giving can be changed or stopped anytime you want.
