From the Rector's desk: We are reminded, in the Gospel reading today, that the human instinct to get ahead of others at any cost, is not unique to any of us. Even Jesus' closest friends and disciples were looking for places of prestige and power, not only on earth but even in the Kingdom of God. James and John (often referred to as the sons of Thunder) come to Jesus, presumably hoping to get ahead of the other disciples, and ask for the most powerful places in the Kingdom, to sit on Jesus' right hand and left hand. In other words, they want to be in higher places than any of the other disciples. Jesus reminds them that God alone is in control of that. Once the other disciples hear about these brothers trying to make a backroom deal with Jesus they become angry. Jesus had to call them together to remind them that they are all behaving badly, and setting poor examples for others that need to be told about the Kingdom. Jesus reminds them that they are called to be humble servants of one another, not clamouring for places of power and authority over others. They are expected to be different than the Gentiles who act in this fashion. He reminds them that even he, the very Son of God, did not come to have others serve him, but to be a servant of others. One thing we see in the world

today is a drive to reach the top of the ladder (which is of itself very noble), the problem is how we get there and how we stay there. Many, when they reach the pinnacle of authority and power, fail to appreciate those who helped them along the way, and usurp their power in condescending and abusive ways. Its always refreshing to see the CEO of a major company pay tribute to, and, reward the ordinary workers that got him/her to their place of prestige and wealth. Very few can claim to have made it on their own, even if they naively act that way. Sometimes we even see that kind of behaviour in the Church, those, who believe that they are more entitled because they have been there longer. The lesson Jesus teaches today is that none of us have any monopoly on the love and grace of God; whether we came into the church today or have been there all our lives, we are of equal value to God. As church leaders, first of all, we are servants, servants of God and servants of one another, for we serve God by serving others. When others come among us we do not try to exclude them or ignore them, we become their servants, we become as Christ to them, so that the glory belongs to God and not us. Its not easy to tame that human desire to get ahead of others at any cost, but, if we use the example of servanthood set by Jesus, we can do it. (Rev. Randy)


