From the Rector's desk:


Today, in the lectionary of the church year, we commemorate The Baptism of the Lord. It is especially appropriate that today we have a child to be baptized, Lucy Virginia Rita Oliver, and her baptism this morning makes her one with Christ in his baptism, and, part of the family of God. In this age where we are coming face to face with declining church membership across the nation, and, where many have decided the church is not relevant or important to them, it is always refreshing to still have young parents choosing baptism for their children. The baptism of children is always a sign of hope for the future of our church. With so much pessimism and discouraging statistics on church decline in recent times, I refer you to a very hopeful and encouraging article that will be part of the next issue of The Anglican Journal titled - "Green Shoots": Community outreach fuels thriving congregations. In this article it features 5 parishes that are actually bucking the trend, turning things around and beginning to thrive once more. They were parishes and congregations facing the same challenges of declining membership and financial resources that we all face, but, somehow found creative ways to turn things around. In all of these parishes there were some common elements that led to vitality and growth, such as (1) radical change that led to experimenting and taking risks, and, (2) becoming more concerned with the Gospel instead of maintaining institutions, with outreach to local neighborhoods and community. The diocese of Toronto has about one third of its parishes growing, one third staying about the same, and one third in actual decline. The ones growing are those with a fresh vision for the future and a determination to bring the Gospel alive in their community. As our

diocese continues to seek ways and means to revitalize our parishes, and, to bring the Gospel more alive in our communities, there will be many challenges, and, it might well be the reality that some parishes and congregations will cease to be, or will exist under a different structure. There are a lot of huge churches that remain near empty on a Sunday morning, and, any life in them is getting sucked away because the few remaining faithful are becoming tired and discouraged from all the hard work of just keeping the doors open. The days of survival for many such churches are quickly drawing to a close. We are in a unique situation here in the parish of St. Philip's that, given much vision and determination, we can be an example to the rest of the diocese of a parish thriving and making a difference in our community. As we begin this new year of 2020, it is my desire that we will find many ways to grow our parish in membership and resources. I hope and pray that we can find ways to reach into our community and engage other people in meaningful and lasting ways. At this time we have a very active, energetic and determined number of people in positions of leadership, and really doing tremendous good work in the parish; however, the reality is that people get older, they grow weary, and eventually can't maintain the same level of energy and commitment, therefore, it is critical that we involve more people in the life and ministry of the parish. This work of *mission* is a collaborative work that calls for work and input from everyone. I hope and pray that by the time we have our annual meeting in late February we will have interest from people in our parish to get involved in serving on a mission committee, geared to finding ways to bring the Gospel more alive around us.
