Launching out into the Deep....Into New Spiritual Depths

#### From the Rector's Desk

One of the things we have highlighted in our Mission Statement is "To be a House of Prayer", so we will focus on prayer in our reflections today. Of course we are a House of Prayer at St. Philip's; however we encourage deepened prayerfulness for a deepened spirituality and a deepened relationship with our Lord. At a Diocesan prayer workshop I attended it was said that "every congregation should be a prayer centre." With this thought in mind, I encourage people to consider visiting the church for a quiet place free from distractions for a deepening relationship with our Lord through prayer. At such times our hearts and minds are quieted, in God's loving presence we have nothing to hide, and we can enjoy the very presence of our loving Father.

I am deeply thankful for the work of our Prayer Team which writes and leads our Intercessions at worship. It is my desire and hope to initiate some additional aspects of prayer through the Anglican fellowship of Prayer program.

"Draw near to God and He will draw near to you." (James 4:8). In prayer, we draw near to God who is always present to us; otherwise our prayers may seem to be like empty words spoken to someone who does not seem to be there. Perhaps that is why prayer has often been defined as "the practicing of the presence of God." Prayer, then, is both a gift and a discipline.

If God is present to us, then prayer becomes conversation and relationship. But if it is one-sided, then prayer becomes a monologue or, worse still, a process of telling God what he ought to do while hardly recognizing his presence and his desire to be in a close and personal relationship with us. True prayer involves listening as well as speaking; and of deepening a relationship based upon faith and trust in a faithful and loving God. Conversation is the natural way in which we grow near to someone, the way we grow in trust and come to care for and love another person. It is like this with God...and we call it Prayer. I cannot emphasize enough the importance of deepened relationship with the Lord. Prayer is a gift that God has given us to help deepen that relationship.

Our Lord promised to answer our prayers when he said "ask and it will be given you, seek and you shall find; knock and it shall be opened to you." He also promised that our heavenly Father is a gracious God and will not withhold any good gift from his children.

Faith plays an important part in our praying. We pray by faith...trusting God. We pray consistently...trusting God. We pray for healing...trusting God. We pray for others...trusting God. We pray for forgiveness...trusting God. It would seem terribly wrong to pray earnestly to God and not to have a genuine expectation that God hears and answers our prayers. To come to God in prayer with

a skeptical mind is really to be deaf to him. In order to experience the reality of prayer, we need to come to prayer in a spirit of expectancy; fully believing that God is there both wanting and able to respond.

How God answers prayer is not always clear to us and it is very difficult to describe anyway. God is a God of surprises and he does answer and often we are surprised. Sometimes we recognize that God has answered when we look back at things. Sometimes God's answer can be discerned from a scriptural passage. Sometimes we experience an unusual peace or compassion. Sometimes we are given an unusual awareness of how he answers and the more we listen for God's voice the more we will learn to sense his presence. Sometimes God does not answer in the way we expect. For instance Paul had, what he called, a thorn in the flesh. He writes this: "Three times I appealed to the Lord about this, that it would leave me, but he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made **perfect in weakness."** What I take from this is that God's answer to prayer often comes in the form of grace sufficient for whatever we face in life.

God's answer to prayer often comes to us as God's gift of Himself, His "peace". "Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be known to God, and the peace of God, which passes all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. (Eph. 4:6-7)

May we grow in prayer and learn to find quiet space and pray often. Pray with faith and with an awareness of God's presence and with a spirit of expectancy. Pray for a deepened and intimate relationship with our Lord. Amen.
