Good morning, welcome to the third Sunday in Advent here at St. Philip's Church.

Today we light the candle of "Love" on our Advent wreath. As we light this candle we are reminded that we are getting closer and closer to the birth of the Christ-child. His birth shows us the greatest love story ever told. In John's gospel we read these wonderful words – "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him may not perish but have eternal life." (*John 3: 16*)

In the fullness of time, God sent his Son into the world, not as a warrior ready for war, but as a child born in a stable. That child was born for you. Why? Because God loves you so much that he sent his son into the world for you. That is really a love story in itself. Soon we will be celebrating the greatest love story ever known to the human race.

As we say today, in the lighting of the candle, "Love is like a candle burning in a dark place". We are told not to put our candle under a bushel but let it shine so all the world can see it. We are called to be his light in the world bringing hope, happiness, peace and joy to those who are living in darkness. That darkness has caused them to be separated from God's love and the love of other people. May this Christmas season mean that each one of us will be a light to others. I am suggesting that you be a light and invite a friend or neighbor to come with you to celebrate the birth of Christ through the Eucharist on Christmas Eve. Let the doors of this church be always open to welcome strangers, former members who want to return to church, and family members. If we are going to do it, now is the right time. Therefore, pray and go and invite someone to come with you. Use this motto in your Christian walk with God, - "Be a friend and bring a friend to Christ".

It was John's mission to care for people and he wanted them to repent and find God's forgiveness. It is our mission as well, as baptized people, to bring others to Christ. May we be the light for others in this season of celebrating the birth of Christ because we also celebrate the love we have in Christ.
