"As Jesus walked along, he saw a man blind from birth." That simple word "saw" reverberates throughout today's gospel passage. The disciples accompanying Jesus do not "see" a fellow human being at all. For them the outcast merely provides an opportunity for debate about

blindness as punishment for sin. Jesus, however, sees into the man's innermost being. Using the earthiest of means – mud, saliva, water, the touch of a hand he gives him his sight. And as always in this sort of encounter, outward healing reflects inner transformation.

Witness the newfound courage of this person who had previously been looked upon as less than fully human! While the bystanders and the Pharisees argue and guibble, the man reacts with unprecedented boldness: Why aren't vou listening? Can't you see? Do you too want to become his disciples? I trust my own experience; whoever he is, he has opened my eves and therefore
